DAY 1

Madison Historic Home Tours

Step back in time with the Morgan County Historical Society as you discover the stories of Madison's beginnings and its most distinguished homes including **Heritage Hall**, an immaculately preserved 19th century Greek Revival, **Rogers House**, one of the oldest houses in Madison, and **Rose Cottage**, a modest late 19th century home with a remarkable story to tell.

Get Outdoors at Hard Labor Creek State Park
